- 2. **Buy local products!** This increases freshness, supports local businesses and cuts down on the resources consumed transporting those goods.
- 3. Use cloth and reusable products versus disposable paper goods. Whether drinking your morning cup of coffee, carrying your groceries home or serving your every day family dinners, using cloth napkins, reusable bags and ceramic dishes (including washing), uses less resources from the Earth than the production of paper products and impacts of deposits into the landfill.
- 4. Use a reusable bottle that you can refill instead of buying bottled drinks.
- 5. **Go paperless**, most utilities, banks and other companies that regularly issue bills have online or automatic bill pay.

- 7. **Drive only when you have to,** otherwise take a walk or ride your bike for nearby errands and activities.
- 8. Downsize your car, closet, house, lawn and anything else you haven't used within a year.
- 9. **Eat Sustainably!** Try eating less meat and search for sustainability logos when grocery shopping.
