What is PSH?

Permanent supportive housing is permanent housing with indefinite leasing or rental assistance paired with supportive services to assist homeless persons with a disability or families with an adult or child member with a disability achieve housing stability. (HUD, 2019)

Why Are We Involved in Permanent Supportive Housing?

- CORE is a leader in solving our communities' housing crisis
- Homelessness is a humanitarian and housing issue we can't ignore
- Housing funding streams have shifted to address homelessness and provide more PSH units
- And it turns out the solution to homelessness is...a home

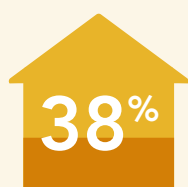

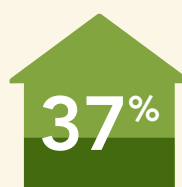

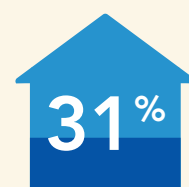
PERCENT OF PSH UNITS

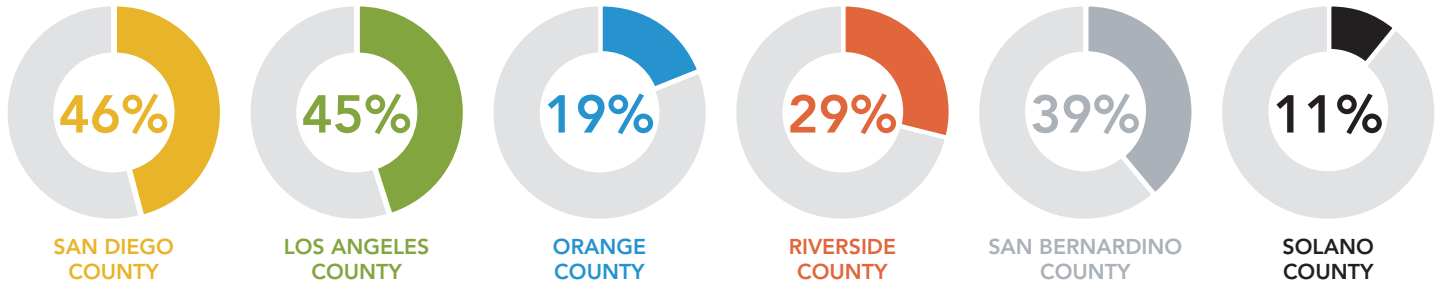

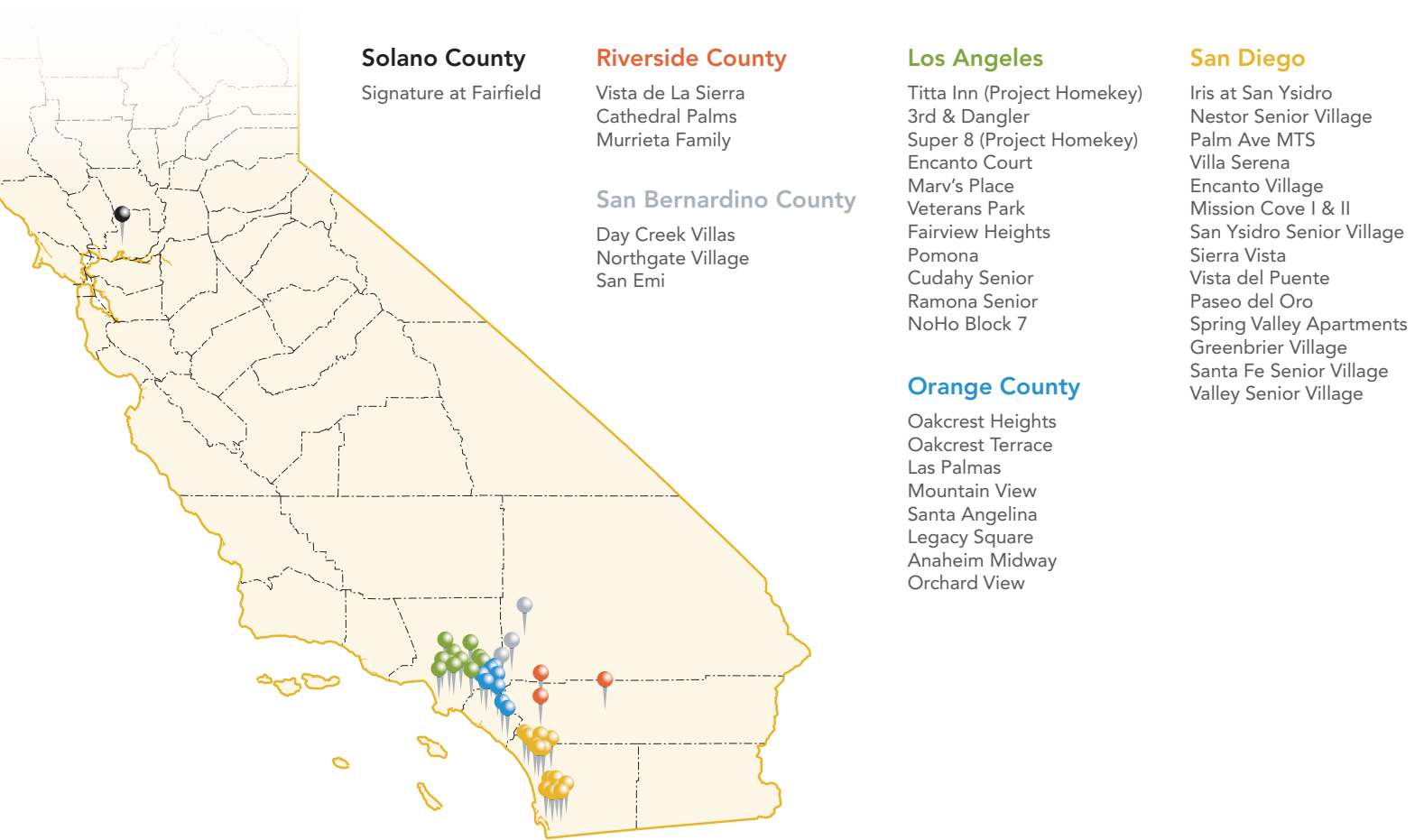
