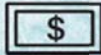

## **Safe Clean Water Act, Watershed Area Steering Committee Stormwater Investment Plan**

*Progress is being made to pave the way for funding of stormwater projects in our watershed! Funds from the Safe Clean Water Program are making their way to a watershed near you. The Upper San Gabriel Valley Watershed Area Steering Committee and the Regional Oversight Committee voted to fund three projects benefitting La Verne. A project to improve the existing Pedley Spreading Grounds to allow for more stormwater capture (thus reducing pollutants flowing out of our watershed), technical resources to further research a project at the Fairplex, treating water flowing from La Verne and funding for scientific studies across the San Gabriel Valley to confirm infiltration rates, have all been included in the plan. In the fall of 2020, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors will make the final vote needed to start the process of transferring funds to get these projects started. These projects will aid the City of La Verne tremendously in working towards achieving stormwater quality and stormwater recharge compliance goals.*
